


Kayla's Corner


Wow!!! Did I ever pick an exciting book to start this past month's reading! ***NATIONAL SECURITY*** by Marc Cameron is unbelievably exciting and eye-opening. Don't start this book in the evening as I did - I read until the middle of the night because I couldn't seem to get to a point where I could lay the book down and go to bed. An amazing and fast story about a giant act of terror in the United States and the people who work behind the scenes to stop it. I liked his main character Jerico Quinn and hope to read



about him again. I will remember this author's name and look for more books by him.

Later: I found his next book in the series - ***ACT OF TERROR***. I expect it to be as good or better than the one I read.

Even later: To repeat myself - wow! I did read it and found it to be as hard to lay down as the first one. I loved it all the way to the end. This author has a new fan in me, that's for sure.



THE TWISTED ROAD TO YOU is a lovely contemporary romance by Barbara Longley. This is the fourth book she has written about Afghanistan war veterans living in a town in Indiana. They've all been good stories. I especially liked this one about a Marine Vet and a divorced mother of a six-year-old.

I read Laura Griffin's latest *Tracer* novel in one sitting. ***SHADOW FALL*** was an exciting, adventurous romance between an FBI agent and the owner of a bodyguard service. The FBI is investigating a murder which turns out to be a series of murders. The chase is suspenseful and interesting. This author really pays attention to detail. I do recommend this book to lovers of romantic suspense.

THE LEGEND OF LYON REDMOND (historical) by Julie Long brings us back to the *Pennyroyal Green* series with a few familiar people. Redmond is a mysterious man who is really three different people. Olivia Eversea has loved him "forever," but has plans to marry another man. This is the story of Lyon and Olivia's romance. I liked it.

Another good historical this past month is Madeline Hunter's ***TALL, DARK AND WICKED*** (don't you just love that title?). This one just hit the spot. What a fun read. Fast and entertaining with secret agents and counterfeiters as well as a lovely romance. It's a stand-alone book, but the first in the series is quite good also - ***HIS WICKED REPUTATION***. If you haven't read it - do.

Of course, my favorite historical this month would be ***DANIEL'S TRUE DESIRE*** by Grace Burrowes. It's a lovely romance, as her books always are. Humor and intrigue are woven through the theme of trust and love. It's a stand-alone book, but you may recognize some of the characters from her earlier books. I loved it!

Despite the fact that I don't like short stories I read two anthologies this month. I bought them because I like the authors. ***EDGE OF DARKNESS*** has three well known authors - Christine Feehan, Maggie Shayne and Lori Herter. Paranormal books are always fun to read and these stories are no exception. Dangerous heroes and unsuspecting and (sometimes) innocent heroines. All three of these are about vampires. I don't always like vampire stories anymore - but these are a good read.

The second anthology is a historical by four well known writers - Sabrina Jeffries, Karen Hawkins, Candace

Camp and Meredith Duran. [WHAT HAPPENS UNDER THE MISTLETOE](#) tells four very different and good stories of a romantic holiday in England and Scotland in the 19th century. I liked them all.


[EVERGREEN SPRINGS](#) is the latest in RaeAnne Thayne's ongoing stories about the people in a small town called Haven Point. I liked this sweet romance between a rancher who is a single father and a doctor. It's a story of forgiveness in many different ways.

Don't read Mary Burton's [I'LL NEVER LET YOU GO](#) if you are alone!! A suspenseful, intricate plot. Scary, scary, scary!! I loved it! The characters are an animal vet and a cop. The situations are well crafted and as I said, scary. I do recommend this very good book.



After the tension in that last book I thought I needed a change of pace - so I picked up *TRULY, MADLY MONTANA* by Fiona Lowe. It's a cute little romance (I am not being condescending when I say that). It's a very entertaining book about a love story with an Australian doctor and an American studying to be a doctor. She has Type 1 diabetes. I actually learned a lot about the disease from this story - as well as enjoying the read.

As if I hadn't had enough drama from the last suspense I read, I started reading Tami Hoag's *THE 9th GIRL*. Action and drama big time! This story of a serial killer and the cops trying to catch him is hard to put down. I liked it so much that I decided to read the next in the series, [COLD, COLD HEART](#). 



It's time for war, and Katniss is leading the fight - as long as she knows who the enemy is.




The Danish Girl




Macbeth

by William Shakespeare


